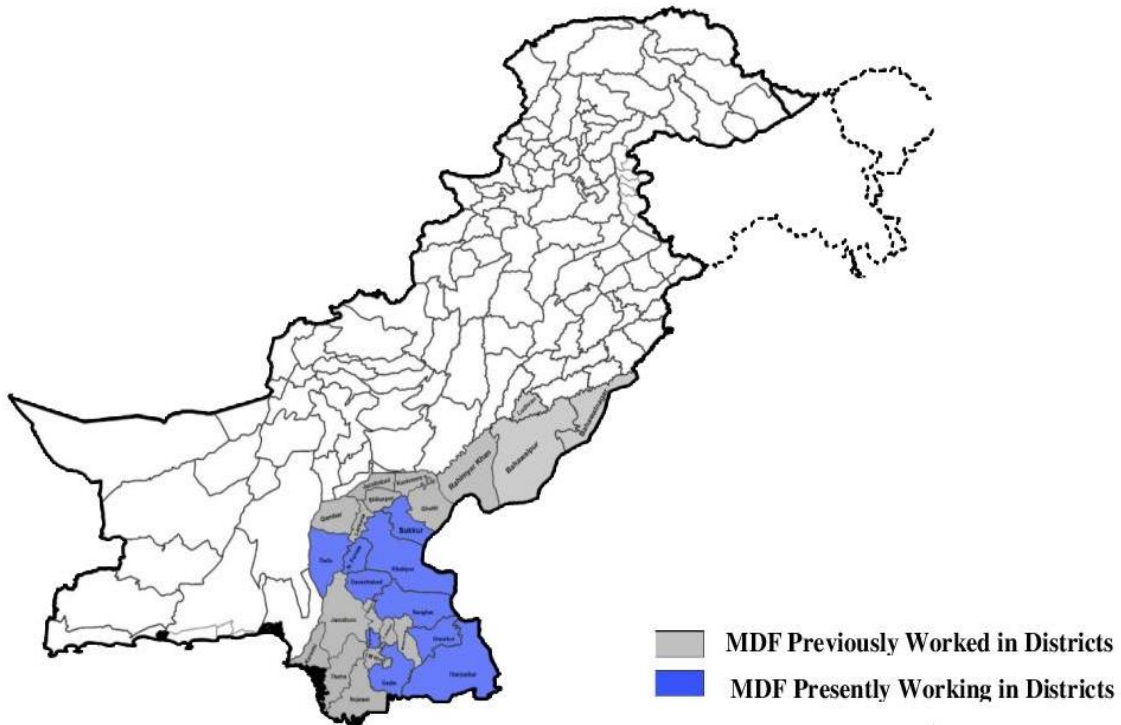

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN
THE GOVERNMENT OF ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF PAKISTAN
AND
MANAGEMENT & DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION

This MOU is made between the Government of Pakistan through the Economic Affairs Division, (hereinafter referred to as "the Government") and Management & Development Foundation (MDF) (hereinafter referred to as "the Organization") a not-for-profit organization registered under Registration of Societies Act XXI of 1850 at Provincial Assistant Registrar Joint Stock Companies Hyderabad Region at Hyderabad and Office at House No. A-70, Block-2, Phase-1, Qasimabad, Hyderabad, Sindh Province of Pakistan.

Whereas the Organization Management & Development Foundation desires to undertake work for the socio-economic development in the country, particularly in the areas of 1) Education, Livelihoods & Capacity Building, 2) Water, Governance and Shelters, and located in all districts of Sindh Province, and for this purpose has submitted an application for registration accompanied by requisite documentary information. Now, the Government is pleased to allow the organization to carry out its work on the following conditions:

- The MOU shall be governed by laws and policies of the Government of Pakistan.
- The Government may:
 - Allow Management & Development Foundation to receive foreign contributions including funds, materials and services, originating from declared sources, through legal channels, subject to reporting requirements.
 - Allow Management & Development Foundation to open, maintain and operate accounts for the receipt of its work.

Provided that the for opening and operating foreign currency accounts, the Management & Development Foundation shall seek permission of the State Bank of Pakistan, under the applicable law and rules;
 - Allow Management & Development Foundation to maintain its office at Hyderabad, Sindh Province of Pakistan and to open other offices, if required, with prior written approval of the Government, subject to the convenience of the Provincial Government / local government and compliance with applicable law / rules.
- Income Tax Exemption:
 - The Management & Development Foundation may avail 100% tax credit subject to the provision of the Section 103C and approval of the Commissioner Inland Revenue concerned, under Section 20A of the Income Tax Ordinance 2001.
- Obligations of the Organization:

The Organization shall:

 - Receive foreign contribution through formal banking channel only. However, NDO will comply with the Anti Money Laundering and other applicable laws as applicable in Pakistan.
 - Not be allowed to retain foreign contribution in foreign exchange or in their foreign currency accounts but they will have to convert the same into PKR. (except for utilization in line with the purpose) specified in MOU. However, if there is a justifiable need to maintain a part of the donation in foreign currency, NDO will have to obtain SSBP prior approval. For this purpose, NDOs may approach Exchange Policy Department of SSB alongwith the recommendations of EAD through concerned Authorized Dealer (Bank).
 - Use funds, materials and services received by it as foreign contribution or foreign economic assistance from declared sources, through legal channels, for its specific work, and provide to the Government every six months complete information regarding flow of such funds, material receipts and when required by the Government.

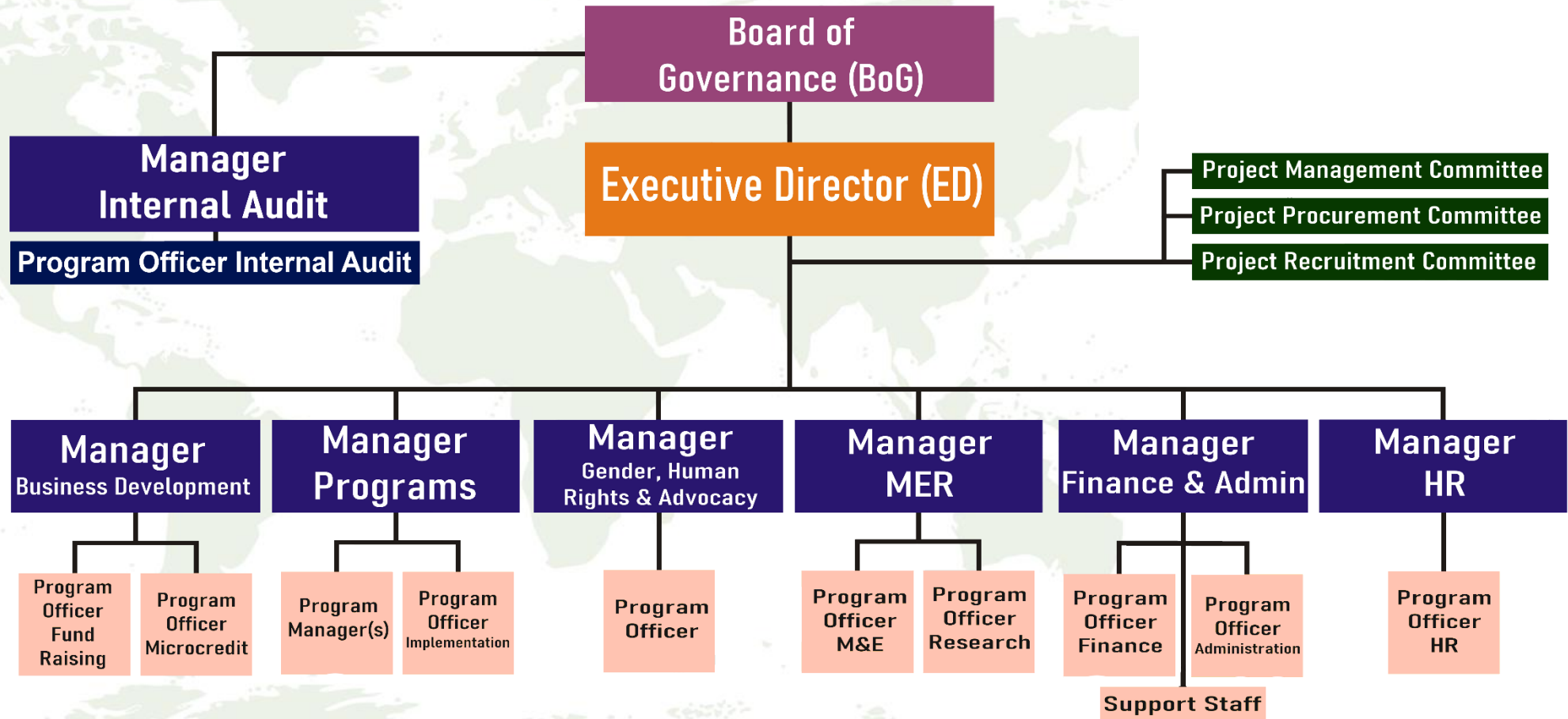
