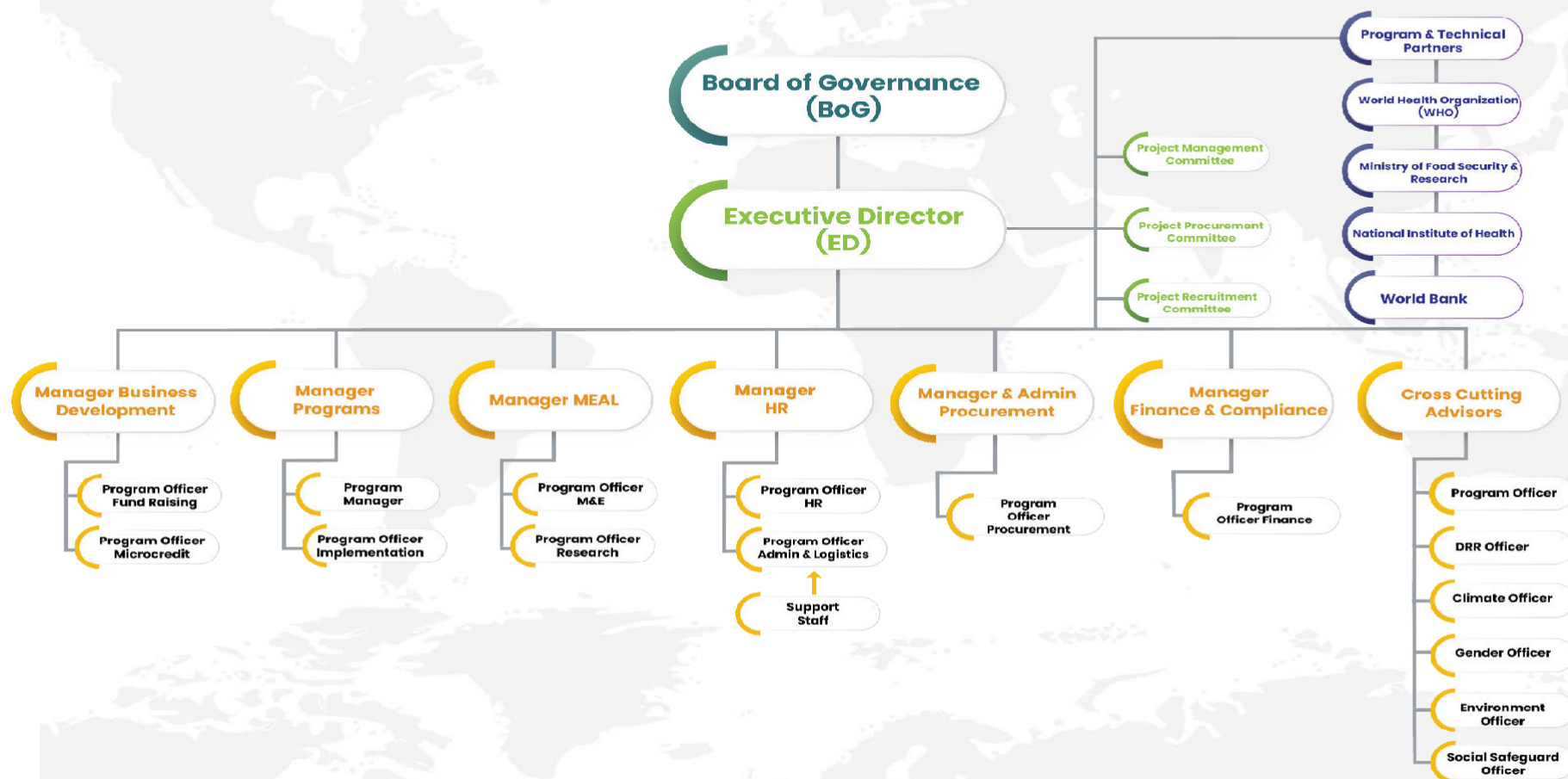
## 9. MDF Executive Director

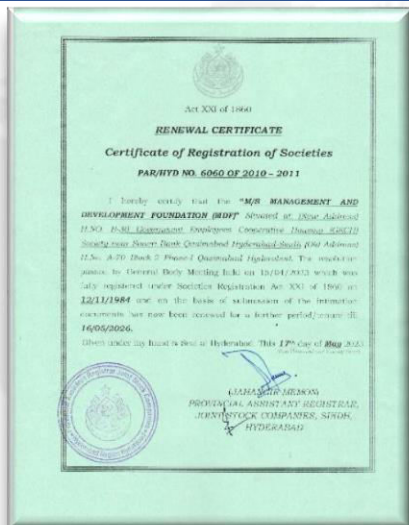

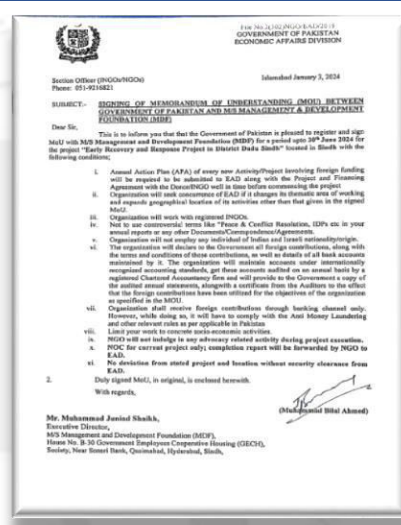
