MDF was founded in 2010 to work in Sindh province for sustainable development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. Sustainable development is a continually evolving concept based on the integration of social, economic, and environmental concerns. MDF’s main objective is to work for and with deprived segments of society to promote sustainable, resilient, and inclusive development. Since its inception, MDF has collaborated with various national and international support organizations and has achieved significant results, particularly in WASH, Water Rights, Protection, Nutrition, and Livelihood.

MDF has well-developed systems and controls that enable it to perform effectively at both higher and grassroots levels. Its well-designed monitoring mechanisms ensure oversight throughout the course of each project. Reporting and beneficiary tracking are also given high priority, as they provide opportunities to assist people who have never received any support and help prevent duplication of resources. MDF’s strong relationships with district administrations and communities are a key strength, creating an environment in which the adversities of the masses are listened to patiently, and plans are implemented with their participation, fostering a spirit of self-reliance.

MDF's Approach to Socio-Economic Development of Communities

Since its inception on September 21, 2010, MDF has focused on social mobilization, livelihoods, and participatory development for the socio-economic empowerment of men, women, and children. In both rural and urban areas, livelihood opportunities need to evolve, as traditional income-generation activities alone are insufficient given the country's growing population.

Accordingly, income generation through capacity building and the development of linkages has been a core policy of MDF. We believe that social development can be achieved through:

- a. Understanding the problems and identifying opportunities to create spaces for women's inclusion and to promote leadership at the community level.
- b. Strengthening target communities to organize as networks and social institutions that support women's leadership.
- c. Capacity building of women-led groups, communities, social institutions, and youth to alleviate poverty through empowerment and gender equality.
- d. Developing linkages with Community Support Organizations (CSOs), government departments, and the private sector to enhance accountability, responsiveness, and collaboration.

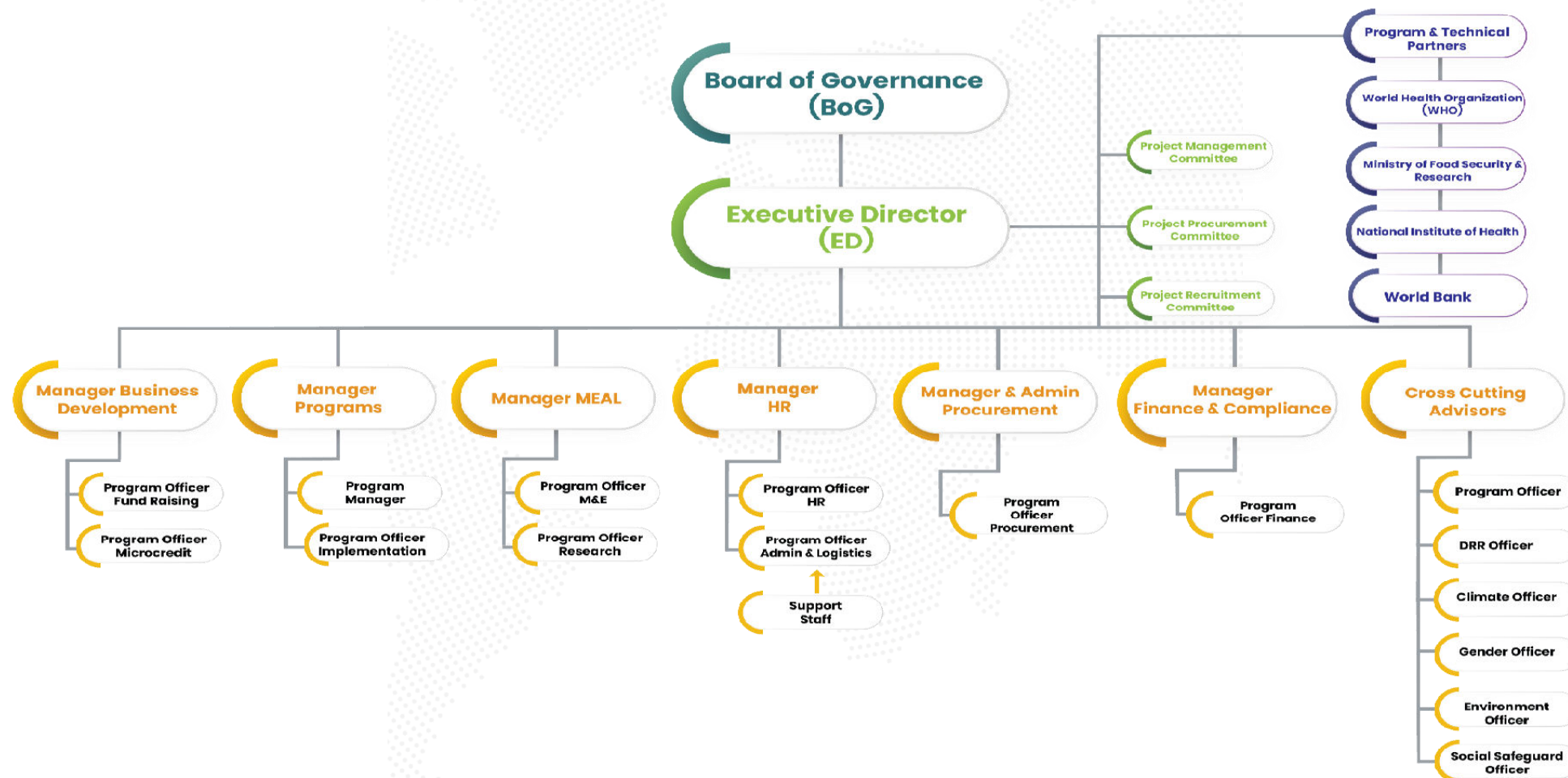
8. Governance
