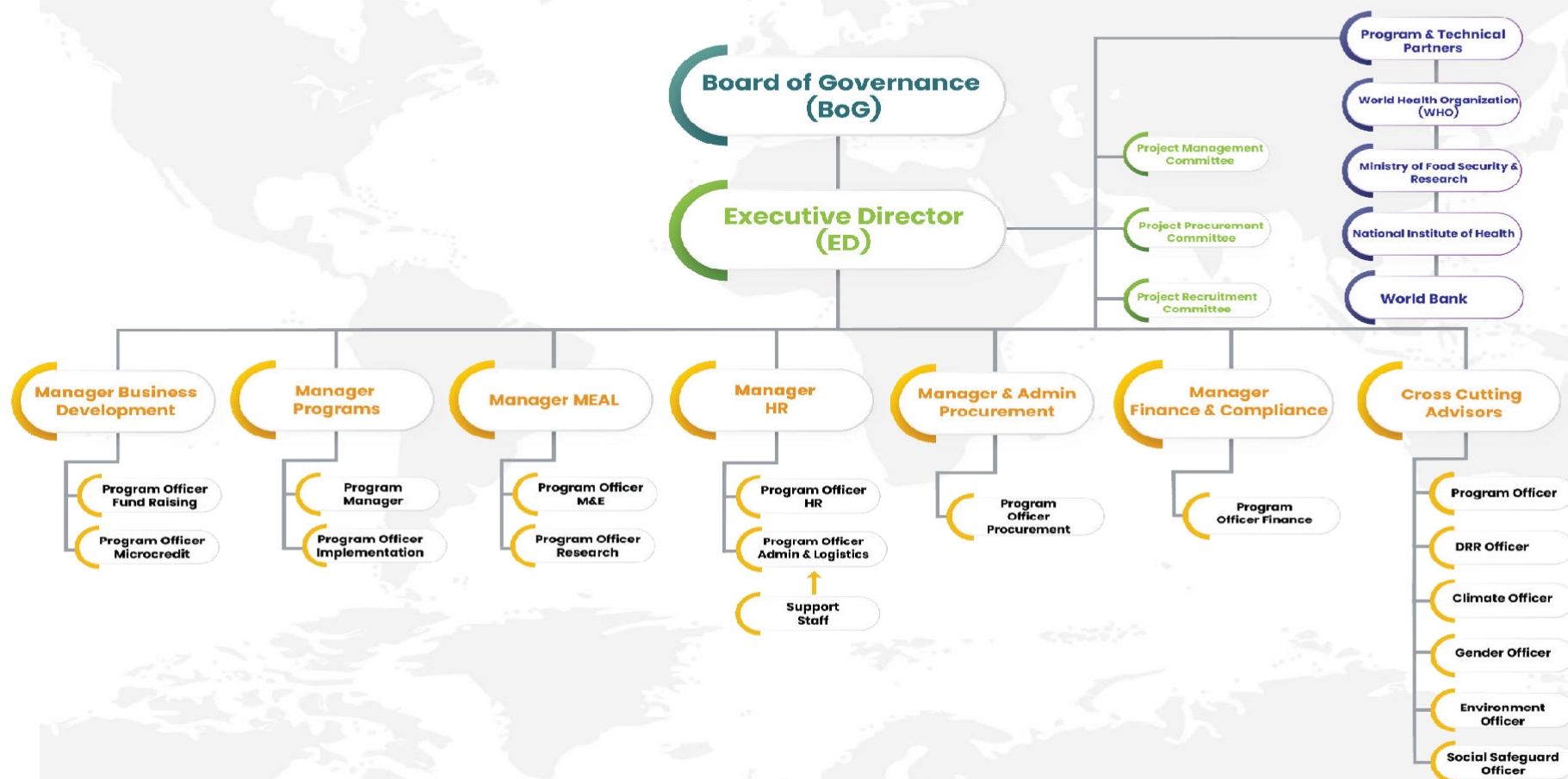
9. MDF Executive Director

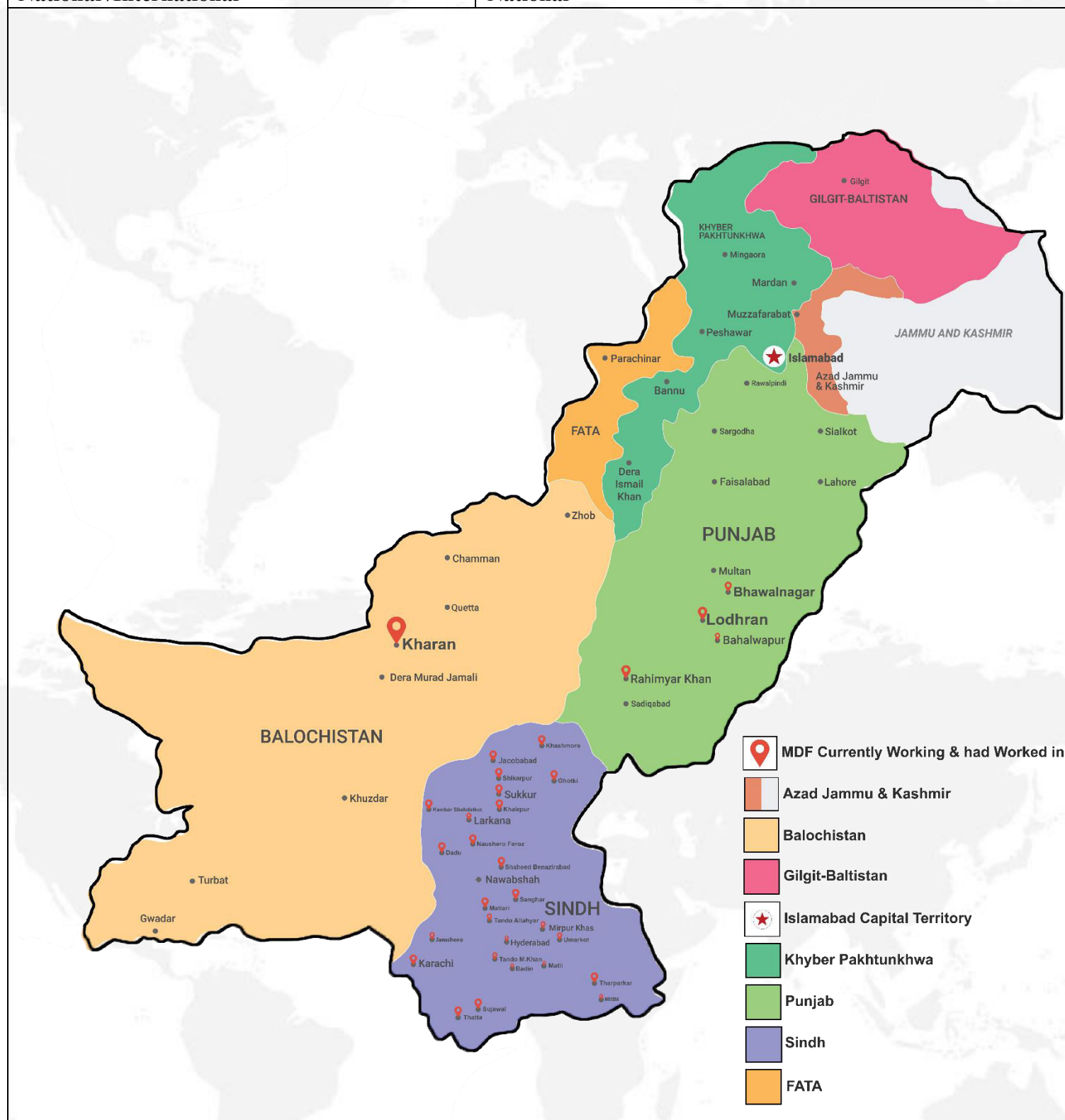
