Since its inception MDF has worked with various national and international support organizations and made significant achievements especially in WASH, Water Rights, Protection, Nutrition and Livelihood.

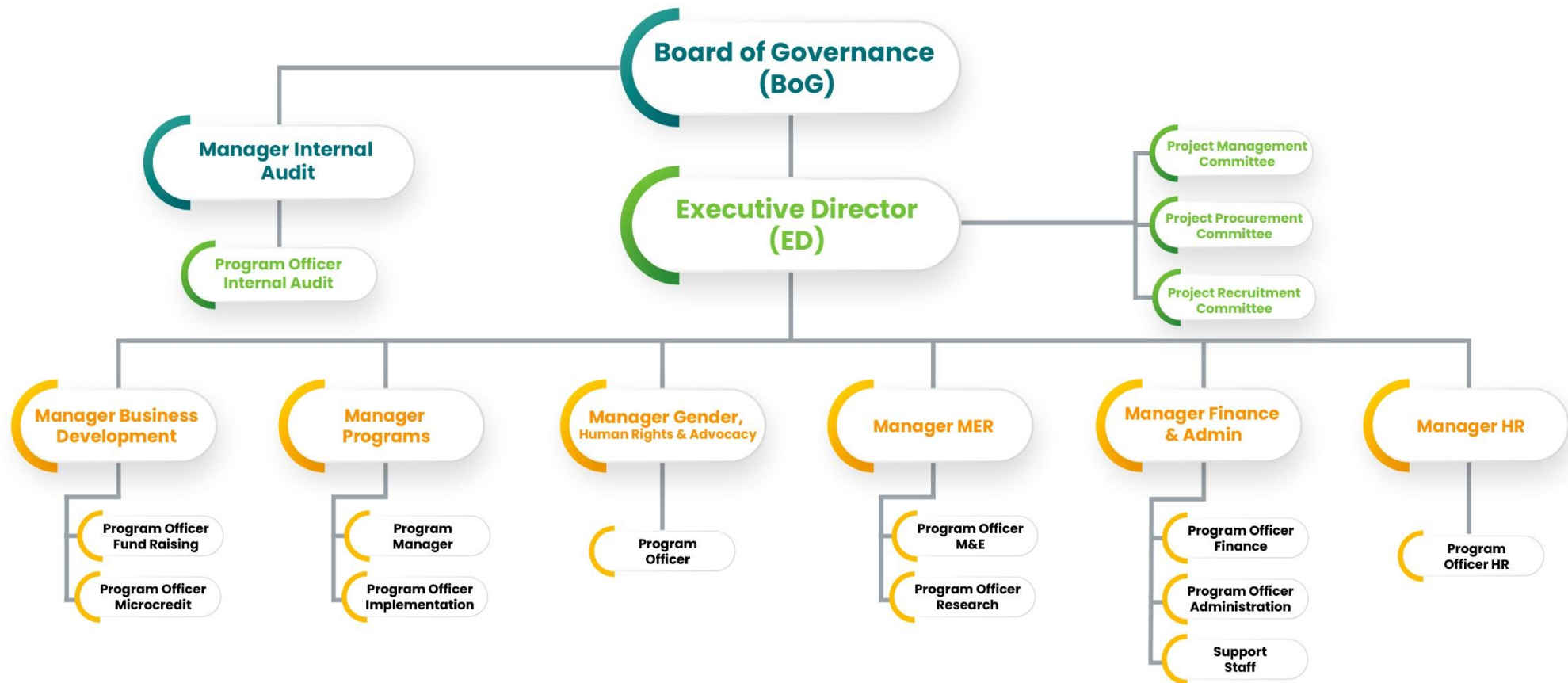

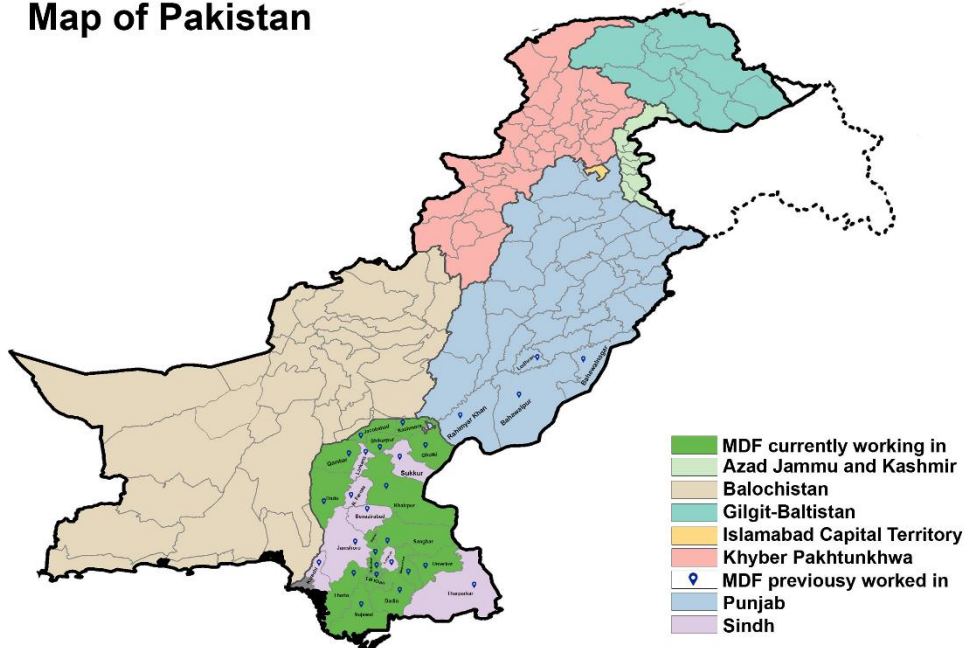
